By enrolling in six or seven courses per semester, our students engage deeply in meaningful academic opportunities in addition to their challenging core coursework.

DESIGN OF CURRICULUM

The curriculum at the Miller Drive Campus parallels the college preparatory track at the Preparatory Campus. The classes provide a unique, supportive program of studies for students who benefit from smaller classes, ranging from eight to 12 students. Based on the students' academic strength, they are able to take anywhere between two and five classes. They attend the Preparatory Campus for additional academic classes, Signature Academic Programs and electives. Classes taken at the Preparatory Campus are indicated as such on the Miller Drive Campus transcript.

Advanced Placement: The Gulliver Preparatory Campus offers 29 Advanced Placement courses in all academic disciplines. Advanced Placement examination results for 2018 include:

SIGNATURE ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Architecture: Gulliver's program has been recognized as the finest high school architecture program in Miami-Dade County for two decades. The rigorous, individualized curriculum exposes students to a realistic environment in which they implement the techniques they learn through design, two-dimensional presentations and three-dimensional modeling. Students generate all presentations on the latest release of AutoCAD/Revit software. The coursework provides opportunities for participation in authentic community-based sustainable proposals emphasizing restoration, environmental design and LEED certification.

Biomedical Sciences: Our biomedical sciences program is designed to provide a sound academic foundation for future studies in specific fields such as medicine, biomedical engineering and health sciences. Strong research and writing components drive the program. An advisory board consisting of a team of professionals from medical schools throughout Florida consults on curricular and pedagogical matters and engages students in real-life opportunities in various related fields.

Engineering: Applying physics, mathematics and computer programming to solve real-world problems, Gulliver's Engineering Department leads the way in curricular innovation. The program challenges students with courses that introduce them to civil, electrical and mechanical engineering. They complete projects that often extend to supplemental, after-school programs such as the National Engineering Design Challenge – where Gulliver Preparatory has twice won first place.

Field Studies: With an emphasis on marine science, the Field Studies program gives students opportunities to acquire the skills to conduct scientific research in various environmental conditions. With an emphasis on experiential learning, students in Field Studies collaborate with local and international organizations as well as universities, attending seminars by experts in topics like photography, writing, and specialized research. Taking frequent trips to the Everglades, Biscayne Bay, and various spots in the Caribbean, Field Studies students take advantage of Gulliver's Miami location to investigate and confront real-world environmental issues, preparing them for research opportunities in college and beyond.

International Business and Entrepreneurship: This program includes a curriculum of unique coursework, in addition to higher-level economics and mathematics courses. Students follow a sequence of four classes: Introduction to Business, Entrepreneurship Honors, International Business Honors and Capstone Project Honors. Participation in Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA) competitions and interaction with guest speakers from the business community are integral to the student experience.
